Analysis:

As the result of a recent BC Supreme Court decision in a case brought by fish-farm critic, Alexandra Morton, it appears that the BC government has no jurisdiction to regulate fish farms - a fact apparently accepted in the BC Liberal platform. That being said, there will be opportunities for the BC government to influence the federal government's regulation of the industry, or to negotiate with the federal government to regain control over the industry. The NDP, based on the work of the Sustainable Aquaculture Committee, has proposed a specific and aggressive timeline and approach for regulating fish farms.
