Analysis:

A strong law for protecting species and ecosystems at risk would: identify species and ecosystems at risk through an independent, scientific listing process; immediately protect the full habitat of listed species and ecosystems until a final decision is made about how much long-term protection they need; and, restore species and ecosystems to health. The BC Liberals have amended the BC *Wildlife Act* to better protect endangered species; however, the Act does not require a science-based approach to species protection and does not generally allow for the protection of species habitat. To date the sections have not been used, and species at risk remain without protection. While the BC Liberals have recognized the need for further work on this, the NDP and Green platforms propose new legislation, and the NDP has specific commitments related to engaging directly with private land owners. Some indication of the NDP approach may be found in their 2008 private members bill on the topic, which was similar to progressive legislation on this topic from Ontario.
